Knight, by Allied, Portable Superheterodyne, Model B10600-6. I've managed to find documentation of a model B10600-, 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, but can't find anything on 6. It appears that these models were made in 1941, but again, I can't find much information. It looks as if the ON/OFF switch is actuated as the door is opened and closed. There is a #27 hand stamped on the inside back cover. I don't know if it's an inspector number, or a production number, but I'm hoping it's a production number. This unit is in very nice condition, with some minor wear, (see photos). I don't know if it works or not. I don't know where you'd get the right batteries..(see schematic).

The above is the eBay listing and what I paid for this radio. What makes this radio interesting is that it is from 1941, sold by Allied Radio under the Knight brand and it used new in 1940 7-pin miniature tubes. It also is very well designed and led the way to the Tom Thumb, Emerson and many small portable radios but were made after the WWII or 1946. ~R Majestic


